President's Corner

Hello Neighbors!

It seems like it has been a long winter (my heating bills concur) and I am sure a lot of you are chomping at the bit to start spring yard chores such as mulching, planting and general yard cleanup. Speaking of cleanup, if you have not done so already, please bag up any remaining leaves in your ditches before they make their way into our lake and add to the sediment/sludge buildup that is occurring at the inlets.

The lake is a definite asset to our community and any preventative measures that can be taken by individual homeowners not only helps assure the lake's viability but may prevent us from having to incur the expenses of dredging and higher yearly assessments. The Board is in the process of scheduling a Lake Study to determine any potential problem areas by comparing it with the study that was done in 2009. We will also be adding more plant-eating carp. This was last done in 2018 and since the fish are sterile, the Osprey, Eagles, and natural drainage have diminished their numbers.

On a side note, remember that fishing at our lake is catch and release since we do not restock it and any chemical runoff from the yards probably make the fish inedible anyway.

One last request. Please remind your kids to not move the rip rap stones that are around the drainage pipes. The stones serve an important function by preventing erosion and potential pipe replacement.



RVs & Trailers

Reminder! Until May 1st, it is prohibited to park any part of your recreational vehicle, trailer, or boat in your driveway ahead of your minimum building set-back line. However, after May 1st, you may park them anywhere on your driveway, but for no more than 5 consecutive days.




Shoreline Maintenance

If you live on the lake or along one of the main ditches:

- Do not allow woody vegetation and trees to grow on the banks of the lake OR ditches
- Large trees need to be kept pruned to reduce the likelihood of dead limbs and branches falling into the lake or big ditches
- Allow a 3-foot-wide vegetative buffer to grow approximately 18 inches high along your shoreline
 - o Buffers filter pollutants from runoff before they enter the lake (many pollutants promote algae growth)
 - o Buffers help deter geese
 - o Buffers help stabilize the banks and prevent erosion
